## WHAT CLASSES DOES A SIXTH GRADER TAKE?

#### Middle school schedules have 9 class periods:

- Language Arts/Reading (often called ELAR)
  - This class is "double-blocked," which means you will have this class for two back-to-back periods per day.
- Math
- Social Studies
- Science
- P. E.
- Lunch All 6th grade eats together
- Study Hall 25 minute class for working on homework
- Elective Class Students are able to choose this class.

#### STUDENT SCHEDULES

Each instructional class period is approximately 50 minutes long with a 4 minute transition time. This is when you will go between classes and use the restroom/get water. The following is what a sixth grade schedule looks like:

### BEGINNER BAND



During the first year of band instruction, students will learn how to play an instrument. They will learn about rhythm, composers, and how to sight read music. Students will perform in the Christmas and Spring Concerts. Instruments include flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, French horn, trombone, baritone, tuba, or percussion. Students interested in band must meet with our band director, Mr. Wolfe to select an instrument prior to being enrolled in band. Instrument Selection Night will be held on April 11 between 5 - 7 p.m. in the Groves Middle School band hall (enter through cafeteria doors.)

#### CHOIR



Beginning choir is designed to develop good singing habits and to direct the students toward a positive choir experience. Students are taught the basics of music, including simple music theory, solfege and sight-reading and vocal technique. Students will learn to sing a variety of styles- ranging from traditional choral music to popular music to vocal solos. 6th grade choir students will have several performance opportunities.

## THEATRE ARTS



Students will explore various facets of Theatre Arts, with emphasis on performance and audience etiquette.

Pantomime, voice, and storytelling will be studied and practiced. Acting and stage skills will be experienced through improvisation.







#### ART

Students will learn how to draw using pencil, colored pencils, and pastels. Projects areas include drawing, painting, Papier-mâché, and clay. Projects are designed to accommodate all levels of artistic ability. An art fee of \$10 will cover all materials and supplies and is to be paid within the first month of school.



### MORE ABOUT P.E.

All students will take P.E. and will be able to meet their coaches and ask questions during their visit to GMS in May.



Students will have lockers in the gym dressing room for their gym clothes and tennis shoes. Combination locks are used for these lockers (they are attached to the locker itself)- start learning how to use one now! Click Here to Practice a Combination Lock!

Students will not dress out in their uniforms for the first few days.

Participation in before and after school practices for specific sports starts in <u>seventh grade.</u>



#### GIRLS P.E.



Girls are required to purchase their uniforms. A form with specific uniform information will be given to the girls in May when they visit GMS and another will be mailed to you in August.

Girls will bring their uniforms to school on Monday mornings, leave the uniform at school for the week, and take their uniform home on Fridays to be washed.



## BOYS P.E.



Gym clothes are provided and laundered by the school. Boys are required to pay a \$20 fee for this service. Boys provide their own shoes and socks.
